## **Daniel D. Angiolillo, Retired Justice of the Appellate Division, Second Department, Joins Appellate Practice as Of Counsel**

After twenty years of service to the New York State judiciary, retired Justice Daniel D. Angiolillo is joining David A. Gallo & Associates LLP as Of Counsel to oversee the Firm's appellate practice.

During his final seven years on the bench, Justice Angiolillo served as an Associate Justice of the Appellate Division, Second Department, with a designation of Senior/Constitutional member of the court by Governor David A. Paterson in December 2010. He decided over five thousand decisions and authored many opinions, including the Appellate Division, Second Department's decision in *Aurora Loan Services, LLC, v Steven Weisblum*, 85 A.D.3d 95 (2011), which set forth the prevailing standard for RPAPL 1304 mailings.

Justice Angiolillo began his judicial career with his November 1993 election to the Westchester County Court, where he presided over a wide range of felony charges, including Murder First Degree. In 1999, he was elected to the NYS Supreme Court. In 2001, he was appointed by Chief Judge Judith Kaye to preside over New York State's first Integrated Domestic Violence Court, known as the "One Family, One Judge Court." He also served on the Appellate Term, Ninth and Tenth Judicial Districts.

Prior to the bench, he served seven years as a law clerk to the Honorable Kenneth H. Lange and six years as an Assistant District Attorney in Westchester County.

He is a frequent lecturer at Continuing Legal Education programs, most recently on Appellate Practice, Judicial Ethics, Domestic Violence, New York Practice, and Health Law/Palliative Care. He has instructed the Appellate and High Court Judges in Ghana, West Africa on judicial decision making. He also authored a chapter for the Lawyer's Manual on Domestic Violence, 6<sup>th</sup> Edition, 2016, entitled "The Integrated Domestic Violence Court: New York's Successful Experiences."

Justice Angiolillo presently serves on New York State's Judicial Ethics Advisory Committee, issuing ethics opinions for over 3000 New York State judges; and is President Emeritus for a New York State not-for-profit devoted to Prader-Willi Syndrome.

He graduated with honors from Boston College with a degree in Economics and received his J.D. from St. John's University School of Law.
